## A Record of Service

### Representative Ajay Pittman

#### Oklahoma House District 99 | 2019–2025

Since first taking office in 2019, Representative Ajay Pittman has worked every day to deliver results for House District 99. Her approach to public service has focused on strong legislation, hands-on constituent support, and building long-term opportunity for families, students, and small businesses in our community.

This report provides a snapshot of her work and impact over six legislative sessions.

## Legislative Leadership & Policy Impact

From 2019 to 2025, Rep. Pittman introduced **111 unique bills** as the principal author, addressing issues that directly affect the quality of life in District 99 and across Oklahoma.

### Key areas of focus included:

- Health equity and maternal health
- Education and youth development
- Public safety and criminal justice reform
- Economic development
- Agriculture and food access
- Technology and innovation
- Tribal–state collaboration

In addition to the bills she personally authored, Rep. Pittman worked collaboratively across party lines to advance meaningful policy.

### Total bills enacted into law with her name on them (author or co-author): 148

These enacted laws produced real outcomes, including:

- Child welfare and juvenile justice reforms
- Food donation protections
- Public safety improvements
- Technology and workforce modernization
- Health and human services enhancements

### In addition to enacted legislation, Rep. Pittman’s advocacy and policy leadership contributed to key executive actions, including:

- **Expansion of SNAP benefits for online purchasing**, implemented through federal approval by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and state-level executive and agency action, increasing food access for families across Oklahoma.
- **Creation of the Oklahoma Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives**, established by gubernatorial executive order to strengthen partnerships between state government and community-based organizations serving Oklahomans.

## Interim Studies & Policy Research

Beyond formal legislative sessions, Rep. Pittman actively participated in **18 interim studies**, helping shape future legislation through research, stakeholder engagement, and bipartisan collaboration.

### Topics included:

- Food insecurity and access
- Maternal health and postpartum care
- Tribal economic impact
- Public safety and high-speed pursuit policies
- Agriculture and community nutrition systems

These interim studies allowed Rep. Pittman to bring community voices, data, and lived experience directly into the policymaking process.

## Constituent Services & Community Support

Serving the people of District 99 has always been at the center of Rep. Pittman's work.

From 2019 to 2025:

- **500+ constituents assisted** through direct casework
- **2,000+ calls and emails handled** by the office
- **400+ in-person office visits** with residents, students, and community groups

### Types of assistance included:

- Navigating state agencies
- Licensing and certification issues
- Workforce and unemployment claims
- Benefits access
- Education and student advocacy
- Elder and family support services

Each request was treated as personal and urgent, because behind every call or email was a neighbor seeking help.

## Economic Development in District 99

Rep. Pittman has been a strong advocate for small businesses and entrepreneurs.

From 2019 to 2025:

- **100+ new businesses supported** in House District 99

- Connecting entrepreneurs to state resources
- Workforce development opportunities
- Coordination with economic development agencies
- Regulatory and compliance guidance

- Job creation
- Neighborhood revitalization
- Expanded access for minority-owned and small businesses
